The hotel is the Southview Park Hotel, Skegness, which is part of the Parkdean Holiday Resorts. (www.southviewparkhotel.co.uk)

They are able offer us a special price for early booking with prices from £130 to £250 for 2 nights based on 2 people including breakfast through to £195 to £375 for 3 nights based on 2 people including breakfast depending on the type of accommodation running from twin, double, king size, superior twin, superior double through to a suite.

There are also 3 disabled twin rooms available at £150 for 2 nights and £225 for 3 nights.

VETERANS SERVICES Op FORTITUDE

Op FORTITUDE is the pathway for veterans at risk of or experiencing homelessness into supported housing or to keep them in their current home.

Op FORTITUDE is funded by The Armed Forces Covenant Fund to deliver a centralised referral pathway into veteran supported housing. The remit of the team will be to work with individual veterans at risk of or experiencing homelessness, supporting them either into suitable accommodation, or supporting them to maintain their current home.

The approach involves creating a pathway from the veteran at risk or experiencing homelessness to veteran supported housing or organisation that can support them to keep their current home and avoid becoming homeless in the first place, as well as other unsupported veteran housing. At the centre of this is a team dedicated to making that link.

The underlying issue causing the person to be at risk of homelessness could be one or more of a range of issues, including income maximisation, employment, mental or physical health, substance misuse etc.

The Veteran Charity Sector has a rich history of providing support to veterans in these and many other areas and have a vital role to play in preventing veteran homelessness. **Op FORTITUDE** will also prove to be a critical resource for these agencies and any veterans they are working with who may be homeless.

The **Op FORTITUDE** Pathway will open for referrals on 3 July 2023, with an initial focus on tenancy sustainment and high-risk referrals and will be fully operation by the date at which the **Op FORTITUDE** funded supported housing goes live on 1 September 2023.

Op FORTITUDE Service Design Overview

Referrals can come from a range of sources, including, but not limited to, the public, the homelessness sector, the veteran charity sector, Local Authorities, His Majesties Prison and Probation Service (HMPPS), The Defence Transition Service (DTS), or directly from the veteran themselves.

Referrals can be made through a dedicated web page, and telephone access, with referrals going to the team that will facilitate referrals.

On receipt of the referral, we will assess:

- The immediate safety of the veteran
- Their current housing situation and location
- Areas, levels, and complexity of need

From an assessment of need, and led by the veteran's own choice, we will match the veteran with the appropriate supported housing or engage in tenancy sustainment activities to prevent homelessness occurring.

As mentioned, moving into supported accommodation may not always represent the best outcome, and we will need to consider wider implications, such as the impact of losing a local connection to the area they are currently residing in.

From an assessment of need, and led by the veteran's own choice, there could be a range of supportive interventions taken, including, but not limited to:

- Tenancy sustainment, where is suitable and safe accommodation, through Local Authority Homelessness Reduction Act Duties
- Referral to Veteran Charity Sector Organisations to provide additional support
- Referral to veteran supported Referrals can be made to **Op FORTITUDE**:

A New Organisation for All Veterans Working within the RAF

Veterans in Defence (Air) is a new network that is already connecting veterans and reserves working across the Air domain. If you are a veteran working in support of the RAF, the network would love you to join as a full member.

The Veterans in Defence (Air) Network is an independent sub-group of the Main MOD Veterans in Defence Network. The network is formed of veterans (irrespective of what Service previously served in), and has been created to unite, support, and inform our country's former service personnel. Founded by veterans, the network is designed to provide an opportunity where people can connect with others who have shared lived experiences, access resources, and find support in their roles - should they seek it.

So, what sets our network apart from other veteran organisations? First, our focus is firmly on creating a system of unity across the Veteran Network in the RAF - meaning that no matter where someone is in the UK or overseas, they can access our network and find friends formed from a common bond. Furthermore, our emphasis is on building a community that is inclusive and supportive of all veterans, regardless of their branch of service, rank, or background. Finally, we are committed to growing a mentoring, coaching and peer support group; dedicated to uniting and supporting veterans beyond their military service.

If you are a veteran looking to find old friends or make new ones, seeking support in your job, or you simply want to get involved and help us build a better future for our fellow veterans, we encourage you to get in touch with the Veterans in Defence (Air) Network today.

WORTH THINKING ABOUT IF YOU HAVE CREAKY HIPS AND DODGY KNEES.

As a veteran, you can ask for a referral to a specialist Orthopaedic clinic at The Robert Jones & Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital, Oswestry, Shropshire, SY10 7AG. There is a specific Veterans Clinic run by Lt. Col. Carl Meyer, an Army Reserve consultant surgeon. Lt. Col. Meyer specialises in hips and knees. If you don't mind a few days away from family, I can assure you it's more like an hotel than a hospital and the food is really good. Having a long wait ahead of you at your local GP and hospital, this might be the way to go to achieve a much quicker result.

What is it? A service for military veterans to have their hip or knee arthritis assessed and, if appropriate, have joint replacement surgery and is led by Lt. Col. Carl Meyer, Military Consultant Hip and Knee Arthroplasty Surgeon at Oswestry's specialist orthopaedic hospital. Lt Col. Meyer is an Army Reserve officer who has been on three tours to Afghanistan and one to Iraq. He is an Orthopaedic Trauma Surgeon with 16 Medical Regiment, 202 (Midlands) Field Hospital.

Who is it for? Anyone who has been in regular military service, including national service.

Where is it? The Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital NHS Foundation Trust (RJAH), Oswestry, Shropshire SY10 7AG, and is a centre of orthopaedic excellence specialising in lower limb replacement surgery.

When is it? Outpatient clinics are held fortnightly at RJAH. (Normally on a Wednesday)

How do I obtain an NHS referral? Through your GP - Ask to be referred to the VETERANS' HIP & KNEE SURGERY SERVICE at Oswestry - And ask your GP to make a named referral to Lt. Col. Meyer. Contact information Email: rebecca.ann.jones@rjah.nhs.uk Fax: 01691 404067 Tel: 01691 404344.

Your records at your GP needs to be annotated with the NHS issued codes for military/veterans, take photocopies of your red discharge book, because he will ask for proof that you're a veteran.

CLOSURE OF RAF ST. ATHAN

Friday 4th August saw the final parade by members of RAF St Athan in the nearby town of Llantwit Major. The station was granted the Freedom of the Vale of Glamorgan in 1974 and Llantwit Major was honoured to host the Freedom ceremony. It was a poignant occasion that this last parade heralded the leaving of the RAF from the home aircraft maintenance and a variety of training for many years.

The maintenance side of the station (West Camp) was ceded to the Special Forces Support Group a number of years ago (now renamed to Churchill Lines). There is just one course of trainees going through the training side (East Camp) at present, after which training will move to RAF Cosford and RAF Lyneham.

A large part of East Camp has been sold to a consortium (Bro Tathan) with a view to building a business park encompassing both East Camp and the huge Picketston site. It is hoped that the Bro Tathan project will attract an influx of people to replace the many hundreds of RAF and civilian personnel lost to the area in the last two decades.

During the parade the main road through the town was filled with people; well-wishers, former RAF St Athan employees and the many veterans who have settled in the area formed the ranks of spectators. The Band of the RAF, in full gold-trimmed dress uniform, led a flight of the last trainees through the town, passing the war memorial in the town centre to proceed to the main street where The Lord Lieutenant of Glamorgan, the Llantwit Major Town Mayor, Air Officer Wales and OC 4 S of TT took the salute. The whole entourage then went on to what is left of RAF St Athan for a formal ceremony during which the Lord Lieutenant inspected the troops.

Comments on Llantwit Major's social media sites overwhelmingly agree that the demise of the station is a very sad event and both friendships and rivalries will be fondly remembered.

RAF Form 700

Those of us who have worked on aircraft will be aware that after every flight, pilots fill out a form RAF Form 700, called a "gripe sheet" which tells mechanics about problems with the aircraft.
